Spending a Day in China and Nepal

Although more and more children today are exposed — via the Internet and television — to how people live in various parts of the world, it is important that from a very young age children learn that not everyone lives the way they do.

In ***I See the Sun in China*** (©10/10, www.satyahouse.com, \$12.95 pb), readers follow a young girl as she travels from a small town in China to the city of Shanghai to spend time with her aunt. After waking and watching her grandfather do

his Tai Chi^o, she eats her congee^o before leaving for the ferry. Her day in Shanghai with Auntie includes lunch, shopping, tea in the park,

supper in a restaurant, and contemplation about her day as she goes to sleep. The text is shown in both English and Mandarin Chinese.

In ***I See the Sun in Nepal*** (©11/10, www.satyahouse.com, \$12.95 pb), readers follow a young girl as she spends the day in her village. After waking, her Ama^o makes her breakfast of chiura^o and tea. Following her chores, she goes to school and has a some time with her friends before going home to do chores before supper and finally to bed. The text is shown in both English and Nepalese.

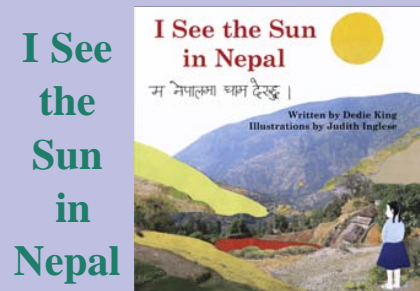
Both books are beautifully illustrated by Judith Inglese with warm, engaging collages made from photographs, paper cut-outs, and drawings.

These are the first two titles in the *I See the Sun Series*. Each book in the series follows events that take place from dawn until night over the course of one day in a different country. The story in each book is simple, yet accurately reflects the culture as seen through a child's eyes. Children will

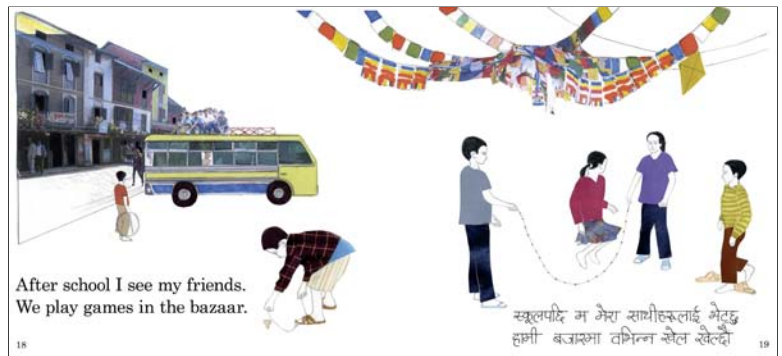

two hundred and thirty feet, are composed of individually crafted free-form tiles. To see some of her work, go to www.judithinglese.com.

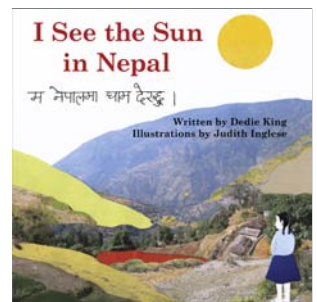
In her spare time, **Inglese** makes books as gifts for her children and grandchildren. In the *I See the Sun* books, she combines photography and drawing in her illustrations.
